The Year at a Glance

Since 1986, the Missing Children Society of Canada (MCSC) has been reuniting missing children with their searching families through professional investigations, public awareness and family support programs. MCSC's team of former police detectives and trained investigators work closely with law enforcement while conducting frontline, hands-on investigative and search activities.

- During the 2009/2010 fiscal year, MCSC investigators managed a total of 122 registered cases:
 - 64 cases were carried forward from the previous fiscal year
 - 58 additional cases were registered with MCSC during the fiscal year
 - MCSC investigators closed 81 cases during the fiscal year
 - 41 cases remained active and were carried forward to the 2010/2011 fiscal year
- MCSC investigators dedicated a total of 5,967 hours in our ongoing search for missing children.
- During 2009/2010, MCSC was supported by 99 volunteers who provided a total of 640 hours of their time to assist us with special events, general administration and investigation support.
- **Small or large - every contribution combined to made a huge impact for MCSC.** The average gift we received during 2009/2010 was \$44.75.

All missing children reunited with their families.

Our Mission

To reunite missing children with their searching families through professional investigations, public awareness and family support programs.

Our Guiding Principles

- As long as there are missing children, our search must continue.
- Assist the police and searching families in the active and ongoing search for missing children.
- Create public awareness through photo and poster distributions, the media, website and other forms of communication.
- Enlist the help of other professionals to assist us in the search and recovery of missing children.
- Provide searching families with emotional support, knowledge and resources throughout the search and recovery process.
- All programs and services including our professional investigations, ground searches and parent support programs are delivered free of charge to ensure that every family who needs help, receives it.

Investigation Unit

In keeping with the year's theme of 'Forward Motion', the past fiscal year was a period of transformation and progress for the Investigation Unit at MCSC.

The year saw the team conduct a comprehensive review and audit of the Investigation Unit's policies and procedures. After nearly a quarter century of operations, it was appropriate to review and update our process for registering cases and documenting our caseload. Through the process, the way we register, categorize and document our missing child cases changed slightly as compared to previous years.

The audit resulted in our organization's ability to more accurately present

caseload figures and outcomes, and rejuvenated our mandate and focus. The team is in the process of formally documenting our tracking process by creating a formal Policies & Procedures manual that will be critical in guiding MCSC's investigation work moving forward.

The past year also saw the Investigation Unit working diligently to strengthen our networks within the law enforcement community across Canada and around the world. We are proud to work with local police and RCMP contacts across Canada, and internationally recognized partners such as the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children in the United States, the RCMP Forensics Unit in Ottawa, and Interpol.

During 2009/2010, MCSC investigators dedicated a total of 5,967 hours in our ongoing search for missing children.

Our investigators managed a total of 122 registered cases, closing 81 of them. (see Figure 1 and 2 below.)

- 64 cases were carried forward from the previous fiscal year
- 58 additional cases were registered with MCSC during the 2009/2010 fiscal year
- 81 cases were closed during the year
- 41 cases remain active and were carried forward to next fiscal year

2009/2010 Total Caseload

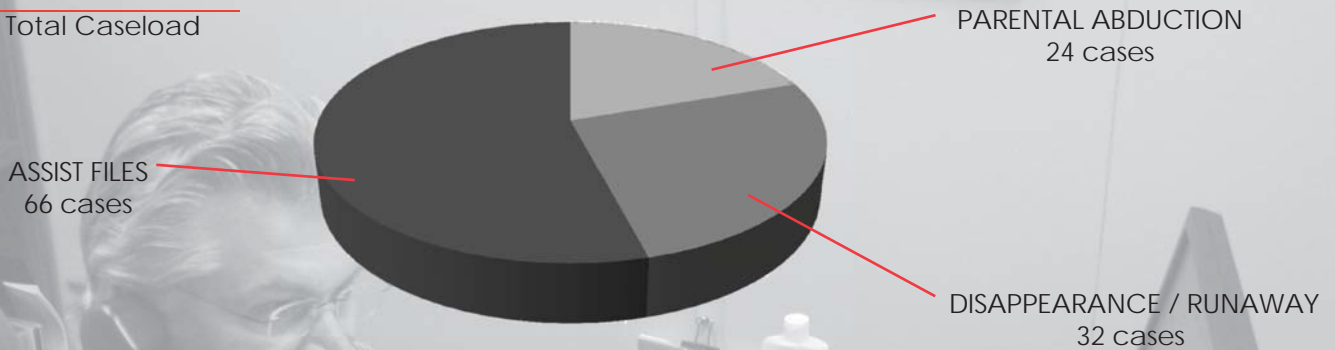
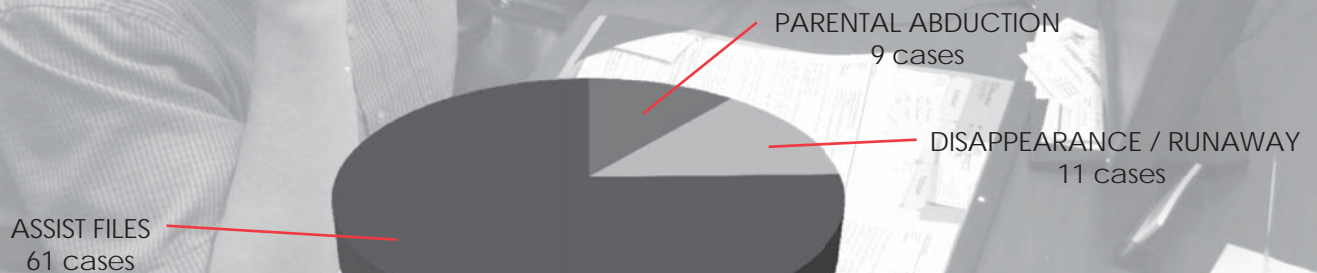

MCSC issued a Child Search Alert in March 2010 on the 17th anniversary of the disappearance of Steven O'Brien from Charlottetown, PEI.

The Alert advised the public of our targeted poster campaign in Toronto and PEI with a photo age enhancement, and announced a \$10,000 reward for information in Steven's case.

The Child Search Alert generated a flood of media attention and credible tips through our 24-hour tip line. MCSC investigators continue to follow up on the new leads in Steven's disappearance.

MCSC thanks our partners at the National Centre for Missing and Exploited Children in Alexandria, Virginia for Steven's photo age enhancement.

INFORMATION

Child Search Alerts: We partner with MarketWire to quickly distribute our Child Search Alerts to media, online communities and other contacts across the country. Child Search Alerts are targeted as narrowly or as broadly in a geographic area as required.

Targeted Poster Distribution: We produce missing child posters and target distribution locally or nation-wide to our network of contacts.

INCENTIVE

Rewards: We can facilitate the posting of Rewards for information from the public leading to the location and secure recovery or resolution of missing/abducted children.

INVESTIGATION

Investigations Unit: Our in-house team of trained investigators offer the full scope of services involved in investigating a missing child case. Our investigators travel nationally and internationally to conduct investigations or to follow-up credible tips. Surveillance, witness inquiries, hypnosis and taped interviews form part of our investigative mandate.

24 Hour Tip Line: We operate a 24 hour toll-free tip line for the public to provide confidential information leading to the location of a missing child. Our tip line is monitored by trained investigators with the experience to evaluate, prioritize and disseminate the information accordingly.

Email Tip Line: We offer an online method for the public to provide confidential information.

Forensics: MCSC works with partner organizations, such as the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children in the United States and with the RCMP Forensics Unit in Ottawa, to develop Photo Age Progression, Comprehensive Composite Drawings & Human-Remain Composites.

Ground Search / Dog Teams: We partner with the Canadian Dog Search Association and Search & Rescue Organizations to coordinate immediate ground searches.

Social Media Scans: We conduct information searches on Social Media Networks such as Facebook and Twitter to assist investigations.

Together with the family of Jeffrey Stuart Surtel, MCSC conducted a ground search for the missing teen in the Mission, BC area over the weekend of August 15, 2009.

Ground crews and volunteers from the Canadian Search Dog Association from Edmonton covered several wooded areas in the Mission region. The search resulted in new media attention for Jeff's case, and covered off a key area of question.

MCSC would like to acknowledge Westminster Savings Foundation for their generous contribution towards this search and other investigations in the lower mainland region.

Jeffrey Surtel has been missing since April 29, 2007. MCSC investigators continue to push for leads in Jeff's case.

Family Support Program

In our ongoing search for missing children, MCSC strives to offer emotional and practical support to our searching families.



MCSC provided reunification support to the Nordgren family in December 2009.

Nine months earlier, the Nordgren boys had been taken into the care of Montreal Children's Services, where it was discovered they had been abducted by their mother

five years before from Kelowna, BC.

On December 18, 2009, after months of costly court proceedings, a Quebec judge ordered the children be returned to the custody of their father and step-mother. The decision ended a long nine months in which the boys' father had to travel to Montreal three times for court hearings, retain lawyers to represent them, and purchase clothing for the boys while they were in foster care.

While the family was ecstatic to have the boys back, their mounting financial debts left them unable to afford flights to bring the boys back in time for the holiday season. They were a family "reunited", but still a country apart.

MCSC quickly arranged flights for the family through WestJet, who has been providing MCSC with the gift of flight since 2004. The action ensured the family would be able to begin the healing process by enjoying the holiday season together.

On December 20, 2009, the Nordgren family was reunited at their home in Kelowna, with the new year - and a new future together - ahead of them.

Reunification Support

When a child is located, the recovery and reunification process begins. Often complicated and emotional, reunifications must be well-planned as a first step in the family's healing process.

MCSC offers support and guidance to families and law enforcement contacts through the pivotal reunification process. Our team and resources are called upon to coordinate travel arrangements, connect with appropriate authorities, and accompany families and children during the initial meeting.

MCSC's publication "Recovery & Reunification Assistance: A Guide for Professionals" continued to be a valued resource for our searching partners and families. The resource is available online in French and English, and printed copies can be provided upon request.

Family Peer Support Network

MCSC has a network of searching parents who volunteer to be available to offer peer support to other searching families.

Together, these searching families can offer support and a shared understanding to each other. This is a powerful and meaningful support to families who can draw strength from the knowledge that they are not alone in this experience.

Work has been initiated to develop this informal network into a formal program at MCSC. Further steps will be taken in the year ahead to secure funding and launch the program.

Education & Awareness

Website (www.mcsc.ca)

MCSC's website is often our first point of contact with the public, our searching families and our law enforcement networks. The site houses an array of information and offers opportunities to interact with our organization. It also features an online directory of our active cases.

With a focus on moving our work forward, the website will be an area of development in the year ahead. Work is underway to develop a more professional, informative and interactive site.

Newsletter

MCSC's newsletter provides information about important case updates and announcements about our organization.

As one of our main tools for keeping in touch with our supporters and searching families, our newsletter was produced each quarter - reaching over 4,000 contacts by mail and and 3,500 by email each issue. It was also posted on our website and linked on our Facebook page.

Media Relations

In the spring of 2010, MCSC inked a unique partnership with newswire leader Marketwire, whose news distribution and content sharing solutions are supporting our search for missing children. The unique partnership with Marketwire equipped MCSC with the ability to move our "Child Search Alerts" into

the age of social media - reaching media and the vast online community with breaking investigation updates in an instant.

As a result, MCSC's media and online presence has increased significantly. It has also resulted in a surge of new tips and awareness for several of our ongoing cases. The year ahead will see our organization continue to hone this critical method of communicating.

'Light the Way Home' Campaign

Our Light the Way Home (LTWH) campaign marked its 15th year, focusing on the month of May leading up to National Missing Children's Day on May 25th.

This May, we aimed to show our searching families that we all stand with them in their hopeful search. Our LTWH campaign reached out to Canadians with some opportunities to personally connect with the continued search for missing children.

The public was invited to join the country in lighting a candle at 8:00pm on the evening of May 25th, National Missing Children's Day. Through this simple act, all Canadians and their families could make a personal connection with the hope we share with searching families everywhere. Hundreds of supporters visited us on our website and Facebook page to officially pledge to light a candle.

Our 2010 LTWH campaign also included an opportunity for the public to directly show their support for our

searching families. Through our direct mail and online campaigns, Canadians were asked to send a personal "Message of Hope" to our searching families.

We were thrilled with the response - receiving over 100 heartfelt Messages of Hope. These messages will be shared with our searching families in a variety of ways over the year ahead.

We were also excited to once again have WestJet take part in our LTWH campaign. On May 25th, WestJet featured our LTWH images and messages through their TV monitors and their on-hold phone system - helping us to reach thousands of people across the country. During 2009/2010, 99 volunteers donated a total of 640 hours to our organization. Volunteers supported our organization through administrative work, assisting with special events, supporting search activities and providing a variety of professional services.

2009 MCSC Charity Golf Tournament

The event was coordinated with the help of an inspiring committee of searching families in the local area. With their incredible support, and the assistance of 15 event volunteers, the 2009 Candlelight Walk raised \$45,000 in pledges. 2010 Candlelight Gala

Our newly branded Candlelight Gala, sponsored by NorthGate Aviation, was held at Calgary's Fairmont Palliser Hotel on May 27, 2010 in commemoration of National Missing Children's Day.
